DAVID BOURQUE – Conductor

David is a native Torontonion and is a graduate of the University of Toronto and the University of Western Ontario. He has been a member of the clarinet section of Toronto Symphony Orchestra since 1983. David plays in the finest chamber music festivals in the world including the Festival of the Sound and the Ottawa International Chamber Music Festival. He has given clarinet and bass clarinet master classes at Northwestern University and is a regular guest instructor at Indiana

University and the Eastman School of Music. David currently teaches clarinet, bass clarinet and coaches the winds of the orchestra at the University of Toronto and is a member of the teaching faculty of the National Youth Orchestra of Canada.



KATHLEEN McLEAN – Bassoonist

Kathleen has been recently appointed Associate Professor of music at the prestigious Jacobs School of Music at Indiana University. She received her musical training at the Curtis Institute of Music and has been Associate Principal bassoon of the Toronto Symphony Orchestra since 1992. She has had the honour of being invited to perform with the World Orchestra for Peace under the baton of Maestro Valery Gergiev. The musicians who make up this orchestra are a selection of the

finest players drawn from top international orchestras. Kathleen is a strong advocate of Canadian music and recently commissioned 3 new works for solo bassoon, harp and strings with Erica Goodman and the Accordes String Quartet for a recording entitled *Nightsongs* released in May 2008.
