**Fred Budd**, a clarinetist with the WW for 12 years, still serves on the board of directors. A teacher, player, and director in many community bands, orchestras, and shows, Fred was the director for many years of the Preston Legion Band, now the Cambridge Concert Band.

**Harvey Gleiser**, a familiar member and soloist of the WW, studied with George Ziegler and was a member of the Kitchener Musical Society Band for many years. During WWII he was a member of the RCAF Central Band and later joined the K-W Symphony, also performing and directing other local groups.

**Boyd McDonald**, professor emeritus of Wilfrid Laurier University, joined WLU in 1976, was half of the Beckett-McDonald piano duo, and is now very involved in recording projects and composing, as well as teaching piano. His recent CD release was the Beethoven Cello Sonatas with Paul Pulford on the ebs label.

**Earl Riener**, a regular member of the WW, started flute studies with Nat Stroff and was a member for many years of the Waterloo Concert Band under C. F. Thiele. He was a member of the K-W Symphony for forty years and performed with the Stratford Festival as well as many other community groups.
